

Intergenerational affordable housing planned for Winnipeg

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A new 92-unit affordable housing project to be built in Transcona will allow different generations of families to have their own homes in one complex.

The apartment complex to be built at 840 Ravelston Ave. will have two wings, one for seniors and one for families, with a two-story common area between them, a news release says.

The project is estimated to cost more than \$25.9 million. The governments of Canada and Manitoba will provide joint funding of \$10.1 million and the province is providing an additional \$14.3 million. The City of Winnipeg has provided a two-acre parcel of land worth more than \$1 million for \$1. The rest of the funding is coming from the Winnipeg Housing Rehabilitation Corp.

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
